BLACKADDER GOES FORTH - NODA REVIEW



CODS. Black Adder goes Forth. Queens Hall Theatre. Cranbrook 9th April 23

'Blackadder Goes Forth' based on the TV series, now brought to the stage as a play, any small screen to stage adaptation runs the risk of imitation but CODS have made the transition work powerfully.

The set, created by the company, I think, by James Harper and Kirsty Scarlett-Bruff was impressive and took us into the trenches of World War One straight away. The amount of detail was exceptional. Also props all the way through in the production were to period and useable, well done to the stage crew and all that made this possible. Lighting by William Stoneman was perfect for this play and at the right level blending in with the set that was being depicted. Sound, Music and make up also must be mentioned, chosen well and makeup when needed was expertly applied, by Penny Tobin.

Rarely do you see a play that you cannot put a feather between the actors, all working together, but this Black Adder was word perfect and acted superbly by all.

Stuart Collier (Edmund Blackadder) took the lead with exceptional acting ability as did Steve Saunders as (Private Baldrick). Supporting these were Richard Gray (General Melchett) James Harper (Lieutenant George) Steve Lenham (Captain Kevin Darling) Rebecca Evens (Driver Bob Pankhurst) Jez Druce (Squadron Commander Lord Flasheart) Hayley Jones(Nurse Mary) Robin Harrison (Brigadier Smith) and of course a well behaved Masie the Dog. You all gave us good characterisations.

Although I wasn't a lover of Blackadder way back, but this production certainly made me think what did I miss.

Co-directors, Kathryn Kember and Stephen Smith clearly have a love for the material which oozes from every scene. But their love of drama really comes to life in the final moments with a poignant moment in the dropping of poppies. Thank you for inviting my guest and I.

SYNOPSIS

Based on the 2010 film of the same name, Made in Dagenham is drawn from the real-life 1968 sewing machinists strike at the Ford factory in Dagenham, Essex which was influential in the passing of the Equal Pay Act of 1970.

The musical focuses on the leader of the strike, Rita O'Grady, as she encourages the women of the Ford factory to walk out after they are re-classified as unskilled workers, while their male counterparts see their wages increase.

After Rita is patronized and snubbed at a union meeting, the women's grievances over their worker status turn into a fight for equal pay. Determined not to be treated like the poor relation, the women vote unanimously to strike and encourage the women at the Liverpool factory to strike also. However, when the American bosses fly in and lay off 5,000 men as a result, including Rita's husband Eddie, cracks begin to show in the women's solidarity.

Risking her marriage and friendships, Rita continues her efforts for equality and gives a rousing speech at the Trade Union Conference, leading to the passing of equal pay within the union. As Eddie finally recognizes his wife's achievements, the women celebrate their life-changing success.

Funny, touching and timeless, Made in Dagenham shows how ordinary people can do extraordinary things when they stand together.

FEMALE CHARACTERS

Lead Character

RITA O'GRADY: (playing age 30s). An average working-class mum, likeable with a good sense of humour. Though uneducated (and not 'well spoken') she speaks from the heart and goes on a journey of self-discovery where she finds an inner passion, confidence and resolve that drives her to fight for the cause.

Solo singing: Several big solo songs. Carries the show.

Main Characters

BARBARA CASTLE: (playing age 40s/50s). Minister for Transport. Self-assured, feisty, strong. Likeable, but does not mince her words or flinch at holding her own against the men.

Solo song, and occasional appearances in some ensemble songs.

BERYL: (playing age 40s+). Funny, foul-mouthed, factory worker. Ballsy, bolshie and inappropriate, she has a massive heart and is very well-loved with her self-deprecating humour (when she's not irritating everyone!).

Solo singing: Female ensemble and occasional solo lines in the girls' songs

CONNIE RILEY: (playing age 50s+) Shop steward and machinist. Has dedicated her life to the Labour Party and representing the rights of the factory women but is tired and disillusioned about what she's been able to achieve in the face of male opposition.

Solo song, and ensemble

LISA HOPKINS: (playing age 25-35) Wife of the Factory manager. Cambridge graduate – well-spoken, eloquent with RP accent but not at all a 'snob'. Longs for a career and intellectual stimulation, she is passionate about women's rights, starts a petition to stop caning in her son's school and befriends Rita.

Solo singing: None. Does not appear in the factory scenes or songs.

Supporting Characters

CLARE: (playing age 20s +) One of the machinists. Excellent comedy skills and good singer. Low in ambition she is saving up to get a flat and marry Ken.

Solo song and ensemble

SANDRA BEAUMONT: (playing age 20s) One of the machinists. Young, attractive, and keen to make the most of her looks. She confidently 'plays the field' but would like to bag a man who could keep her in nice things.

Solo singing: female ensemble and occasional solo lines in the girls' songs

CASS: (playing age mid 30s) One of the machinists. Ambitious and the most sensible and down to earth of the girls. Is frustrated in her work and (idealistically) wants to be an airline pilot.

Solo singing: female ensemble and occasional solo lines in the girls' songs

SHARON O'GRADY: (playing age 13-16). Rita & Eddie's daughter. Resourceful and confident. Wants to be a doctor, rather than conform to the expectations of the time. Does her brother's homework for him (at a fee). (Auditioning age 16 years +).

Small amount of singing. Also, female ensemble.

MALE CHARACTERS

Main Characters

EDDIE O'GRADY: (playing age 30s). Rita's husband. Unskilled factory worker at Ford. An ordinary, likeable, working-class bloke. Happy-go-lucky and a bit of a joker. Loves Rita but is 'one of the lads' and would expect his 'tea on the table'. However, he is a decent guy.

Solo song, and male ensemble

HAROLD WILSON: (playing age 50s). Labour Prime Minister. Able to capture something of the quality of this this well-known politician. Is played as something of a comic buffoon in the show, struggling to find a solution to the country's many problems at the time.

Solo song, plus occasional, brief appearances in a few ensemble songs.

MONTY: (playing age 50s+) Working class factory worker and Union steward who represent the girls at Dagenham – good-hearted and quietly unassuming. He wants to support the girls as he believes in their cause but isn't particularly assertive with the management and doesn't want to swim against the tide.

Singing: part of male ensemble.

JEREMY HOPKINS: (playing age 35-45) Ford Dagenham Managing Director Ex-public school, university-educated and well spoken (RP accent). A conformer who wants an easy life and a submissive wife who will support him in his corporate career.

Predominately a non-singing role. Appears in some ensemble numbers when they include 'the management'.

MR TOOLEY: (playing age 30s +) Ford Executive from Texas USA. Confident, powerful, arrogant, insulting. Speaks over everyone in a bullish way but can also be subtly sinister. Doesn't get the British sensitivity and expects everyone to and jump to his orders and the American way.

Solo song.

Appears later in the story – possibility of doubling with CORTINA MAN and/or other supporting roles.

Supporting characters

CORTINA MAN: (playing age 20s-30s) 'Front man' for the Cortina launch. Cheesy, charming, insincere, and attractive. The definitive 'car salesman'. His only appearance is his song 'Cortina' – so he can double with other supporting roles.

RON MACER: (playing age 30+) Ford Dagenham Production Manager. Working-class middle management. Sings as part of male ensemble.

GREGORY HUBBLE: (playing age 30+) Ford Dagenham Personnel Director. Working-class middle management. Sings as part of male ensemble.

SID: (playing age 20s+) Factory worker and union steward. One of the factory workers on the shop floor who represents the 'fitters' and spouts half-hearted Marxist banter. But his priority is larking about - a 'double act' with Bill. Sings as part of male ensemble.

BILL: (playing age 20s+) Factory worker and union steward. One of the factory workers on the shop floor who represents the 'engineers' but, like Sid, is more likely to be larking about and sharing sexist jokes. - a 'double act' with Sid. Sings as part of male ensemble.

GRAHAM O'GRADY: (playing age 14-16). Rita & Eddie's son. Essex accent. Has a scholarship to the local 'posh' school where he gets caned and is struggling a bit. He gets his sister to do his homework. His father's son. (Auditioning age 16 years +).

Small amount of singing. Also, male ensemble.
