

The KDA festival line up this year looks fantastic with some really diverse and interesting plays.



CALL FOR SHOW IDEAS

Ever wanted to Direct a play, musical or pantomime? Or do you have a new idea for a show that you'd like to put on?

Well now's the time to make it happen!

We're looking for Directors to pitch their ideas for the following slots:

Pantomime in 2016 and Spring Play, Summer Show (this doesn't have to be shorts! but can't be a big production either!), October Musical & Pantomime in 2017. We'd also love to hear from you





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if you have an idea for a play with a small cast, simple or no set/ tech. / costume requirements that can be put on in a small theatre space.

If you have an idea then please let the Show Selection Committee know by getting in touch with Angela (details below) and you'll be invited to come and pitch your idea at the next Show Selection Committee meeting, which will be on March x from 7.30pm in The George Pub in Cranbrook. (If you can't make that date/time, then we can always arrange something else with you.)

Please don't read the word Committee and think that it's a formal, scary process! The pitch is just so we can get a feel of what your idea is and how you would go about putting it on, as well as understanding what is involved and seeing whether it fits with CODS' current programme.

You will need to put together the following information for the pitch:

Tell us what slot you are pitching for and the name of show you are pitching. Give us an outline of the show - genre, storyline, main characters, style, background, where it's been on, is it original etc... and include why you want to put it on, your vision/passion for the production. This doesn't have to be 10,000 word dissertation, but more than the Wikipedia entry please!

Put together details of the cast: How many, gender/ age split - singers, dancers, children etc..., Technical requirements - anything out of the ordinary needed or that you would like to include - think flying in Peter Pan! Who will help you put the show on , do you have people interested/ agreed to be Stage Manager, Choreographer, Musical Director, Set Designer, PR? (A list of all the key roles are included in the CODS Production Guidelines, that we can send on to you before you pitch.) The guidelines also include sample budgets from other show and we will ask you to give us a Draft Budget for your show that has a general outline of some costs based on past shows and taking into consideration anything like large casts, tech. requirements etc. Lastly we'll just need an idea of what experience you've had in putting on shows in the past, either with CODS or other groups.

There's plenty of help if you need it to put all of this together and members of the committee have all put on shows in the past, so they can try and answer any questions you might have.

So please, don't be shy! Get in touch and get your ideas to us as soon as you can!


