# SHOW SELECTION

Hello all, we are opening up opportunities available to pitch for shows including:

The **2017 Summer Show** slot – as before anything from a Singalong to more Shorts or anything else creative someone can think of!

A chance for Directors to pitch a small play to be produced by CODS at the Ellen Terry Theatre, **Smallhythe Barn in September 2017**. As mentioned before for this slot, this needs to be a small cast, with minimal set, costumes and other productions values but high in quality and creativity!

The **2017 Christmas Pantomime** is available for a Director to pitch for and we are also looking for pitches for the **Spring play** and **Autumn Musical** in **2018**.

We've put together a quick overview, on the next page, of what we are looking for in a pitch for any of these shows and to give prospective directors an idea of what they need to consider when looking at putting a show on.



# PITCHING FOR A SHOW

- **1.** Ask the CODS Committee for a '**Production Pack**'. This has everything a Director needs to know about putting on a CODS Production. It lists who is responsible for which area and exactly what they need to do within a specified time schedule.
- **2.** Check whether the performing rights are available for your potential dates. Look on Samuel French / Joseph Weinberger/NODA websites. If it is not available choose something else!
- **3.** Once you are very familiar with your show, you will need to write a 'pitch' to the Show Selection Committee. This currently consists of Angela Woodcock (Chairperson); James Hanaway, Jack Davidson, Louisa Nelson Chambers, Rachel Croft-Golding and Dinah Chamberlin. Proposals can be e-mailed to Angela via <a href="mailto:secretary@cranbrookods.org.uk">secretary@cranbrookods.org.uk</a>
- **4.** In your written proposal include:
- **Which slot are you pitching for?** Spring Play/Summer Shorts/Autumn musical or Pantomime. If pitching for the Spring Play will you enter the production in the KDA?
- Plot Synopsis
- **Character details** how many male/female characters are in the play? How many speaking parts? Is there anything unusual needed for casting (e.g. a dog/puppets/doubling up of cast members).
- Are children involved in the production? Advance planning is needed before rehearsals start as potential chaperones will need to attend a course.
- **Budget** See 'The Production Pack' for examples of previous productions. Productions can be very expensive to put on. How will you keep costs down? Is fundraising needed to help with production costs? NB-All of the points listed below have budget implications which need to be considered
- **Publicity** how are you going to publicise this? Publicity is extremely important. The Production has to be financially viable. Examples of Publicity plans are included in the 'Production Pack'.
- **Costumes** what style/period/where do you hope to obtain costumes from? Will the costumes in the CODS wardrobe fit the potential cast or do they need to be made/bought/hired?
- **Set ideas** large set or simple? Stylised? Indoors or outside? Use of projection? Anything unusual about the set which needs consideration?
- Props style/period/anything unusual needed?
- **Light/Sound/Special Effects** anything unusual? Are musicians needed?
- Previous Directing Experience what, when, with which group?
- **Summarise Why this production?** (e.g. popular show which will bring in money, challenging for actors, many parts for women, good chorus numbers, possible KDA winner, suitable for children, never been performed by CODS before, historical reason etc.)
- **5.** The Show Selection Committee will invite you to a friendly meeting to talk through your ideas. Be prepared to answer questions from the panel. Let them know if you have already approached people to be in your Production Team.
- **6.** The Show Selection Committee will then take time to consider your Directing Proposal along with those by other people. This will take a few weeks. You should then be contacted and notified if you have been successful on this occasion. Good Luck! Alison Withey-Harrison
