3 SAD FAREWELLS TO FRIENDS

JACK PARSONS

When I moved to Cranbrook in 1956 my neighbour Kathleen Carpenter had little difficulty in getting me to join the CODS where I quickly made friends with a really lively (lovely?) bunch of enthusiasts of whom Mr. Bank Manager Parsons and his lovely wife Olwyn were stalwarts. Unlike most of us Jack was never interested in showing off on the boards but was one of those really indispensible people who have always been listed as "Backstage" Struggling successfully against the challenges of dear old Vestry Hall's confines and later in the luxury of Queen's Hall Jack was one of the most reliable ever-presents. This facet was echoed in a letter I received today from Jerry Cartwright. He said that when he was Chairman if Jack was asked or more often volunteered - to do anything he knew that it would be done very promptly and successfully. I had the privilege of proposing the toast of "The First Glorious Seventy-Five Years" at one of our celebration evenings and Jack in his role as President replied: lucky for me I didn't have to follow that.! When he finally stopped working behind the scenes Jack became a regular and much appreciated member of the Front of House team where his efforts with our audiences, special guests and Programmes and raffles were so much appreciated. I asked him how - when well-passed hi sixtieth - he had come to the Foyer he had, of course, walked there from home! When I visited him in his last weeks in Bexhill it was so rewarding to hear from him that he was happy there and of course I had to up-date him about us The Society was the richer for all his years with us and we are the poorer for his loss. As I'm sure many of you are aware by now, Jack Parsons died on the 27th February this year. Although being very sad, and indeed a great loss for CODS (he had been a member since 1955) having spoken to his daughter Jenni, she expressed how his passing was peaceful. Jack had been in a residential home in Bexhill since last October where he was happy and content. Prior to this he had had a spell in the Conquest Hospital, Hastings. He had, earlier in 2011 decided to make a 'Living Will'. Thus, when contracting a chest infection earlier in February nature took its course; entirely Jack's choice. Jenni assures that Jack was comfortable and pain free in his last few days. Jenni is having a small, private family funeral on 21st March at Charing Crematorium. There is to be a Thanksgiving Service at St. Dunstan's Church, Cranbrook at 2.30pm on Monday 23rd April 2012, which would have been Jack's 95th birthday. BRIGHT COLOURS ONLY please!! When I was 18 and a student at Cranbrook School, there was a particular day when I was sitting in what we know as the Principal Ladies dressing room, with my best mate and my Drama Teacher. He was trying as kindly as possible to tell me that I was too sensitive to pursue acting as a career and that I should look at having something else "to fall back on". I was sobbing, "But I can't do anything else!" That drama teacher was Mike Wilkinson. And he was right, of course. I can't even deal with a CODS audition rejection very well! Mike always had words of encouragement for me even though he knew I was only ever going to make a hobby of drama. Whenever I was in a production, be it with CODS or with other local societies, he would come along and support me. He sent me such a lovely letter when I was in Pygmalion, saying how proud he was of his ex-student. Mike was a HUGE advocate of live, local theatre and of encouraging his students to at least appreciate, if not grow to love all aspects of the Performing Arts. He fully supported CODS, even though he was sometimes stuck between a rock and a hard place when the school had to take priority over the Society! I know he was immensely popular with his students and colleagues, evident not least by the amount of people at his memorial service. Cranbrook School, the Queens Hall Theatre and I will miss him. Thank you, Mike.

This is it folks—no more time for negotiation or argument!


There may be slight alternations due to problems with music, etc., but we have come up with a compromise and hope that everyone is happy and can find something they'd like to perform!




